



M A R I N E R ' S S C A R F



Mariner's Scarf

About this Pattern: Our classic basketweave pattern is a great choice for our river mariners.

Note: This scarf begins and ends with 8 rows of a garter stitch border.

Each row of the scarf begins and ends with 2 knit stitches to provide a garter stitch edge. The basketweave pattern develops as you alternate a knit block above a purl block.

Tips for adjusting size. If your gauge is too large, cast on 12 fewer stitches. If your gauge is too small, cast on 12 more stitches. This increases or decreases the basketweave stitch pattern by one repeat.

Cast on 40 stitches.
Knit 8 rows.

Rows 1-6: K2, *k6, p6, repeat from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Rows 7 & 8: Knit across.

Rows 9-14: K2, *p6, k6, repeat from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Rows 15 & 16: Knit across.

Repeat Rows 1-16 until the piece is approximately 38" from beginning, ending after having worked either Row 6 or Row 14.

Knit 8 rows.

Finishing: Bind off loosely. Weave in ends.

300 yards of worsted
weight yarn

US size 7 needles, or size
needed to get gauge

Tapestry needle

Gauge: 18 sts & 24 rows
= 4 inches square in
basketweave stitch pattern
