I'd like to dedicate this issue of *The Knit Before Christmas* to the more than 1,000 individuals and groups who, through their behind-thescenes work, make *Christmas at Sea* (*CAS*) possible and contribute to the continuing success and growth of this special program.

The anchor of *CAS* is the dedicated group of fiber artists from across the country and beyond who create stunning warm apparel, and tailor drawstring ditty bags. This year we were wowed by the number of seamstresses who added impressive design elements, such as cross stitches and appliques, to ditty bags.

Not all volunteers knit, crochet, or sew. We receive hundreds of holiday greeting cards with personal, handwritten, heartfelt messages, many made by schoolchildren. There are volunteers who focus their efforts on collecting toiletries and nonperishable snacks, and we would be hard-pressed to deliver anything without the assistance of packing groups.

Ministry on the River (MOR) Chaplains and Chaplain
Associates coordinate the operation along seemingly
endless miles of U.S. inland waterways. In Port Newark,
SCI Chaplains and Chaplain Associates keep the SCI fleet vehicles filled
with Santa Sacks for delivery during ship visits starting in December
and continuing into January.

I would be remiss if I didn't give a boisterous, technicolor shout-out to SCI colleagues who, without exception, are eager to pitch in and are ready to help.

Accolades to you; volunteers, staff, trustees, and friends, who support *CAS* in all sorts of ways. It's difficult to come up with adequate words to describe how much your involvement means. Your efforts make a tangible difference. Thank you!


